Dear friends and colleagues,

WEBIN cordially invites you to attend our multiplier event, which will be held on Monday, December 4th, as part of the Erasmus+ project "*Use of Digital Tools for Dialogue and Inclusion: eDialogue.*" The aim is to present potential solutions to those involved in education issues, addressing sensitive topics such as social exclusion, discrimination, racism, segregation, peer violence, online violence, radicalisation, fake news, and misinformation through open dialogue and the use of digital tools.

The content presented during the event is intended to assist teachers in primary and secondary education, educators in non-formal education, decision-makers, and, in the long run, policymakers in the educational context of Serbia. The goal is to improve their learning and teaching practices without negatively impacting the well-being, motivation, or social inclusion among students. The event also seeks to create better conditions for all students to develop awareness of the importance of empathy, tolerance, understanding, and dialogue to avoid negative consequences caused by a lack of compassion and understanding of someone's differences and/or social background/identity.

The event provides an opportunity to receive and exchange information on related topics in the context of different European countries. Project partners have conducted relevant research in Serbia, Spain, Germany, Greece, Cyprus, and Poland to find answers on how to combat intolerance and negative extreme attitudes that often lead to violence in primary and secondary schools.

During the event, you will have the chance to become acquainted with the latest tools, methods, and approaches that can offer insights into various solutions for combating hatred, abuse, and violence in primary/secondary schools and/or nonformal education organisations caused by intolerance and non-acceptance of diversity. Proposed methods and procedures will also be discussed, aiming to help stakeholders





in the educational context prevent the emergence of hatred, violence, extremism, discrimination, misinformation, and more through dialogue and tolerance.

Participation in the event is free and is of primary interest to various stakeholders in the field of primary and secondary education, including teaching staff, experts in sociology, pedagogy, psychology, educators in non-formal educational contexts, decision-makers at the primary and secondary education levels, policy creators at the primary and secondary education levels, etc.

This event is organised within the framework of the eDialogue project, funded by the Erasmus+ programme for the purposes of boosting cooperation and networking in primary and secondary education.
